Key Vocabulary: Terms and Definitions

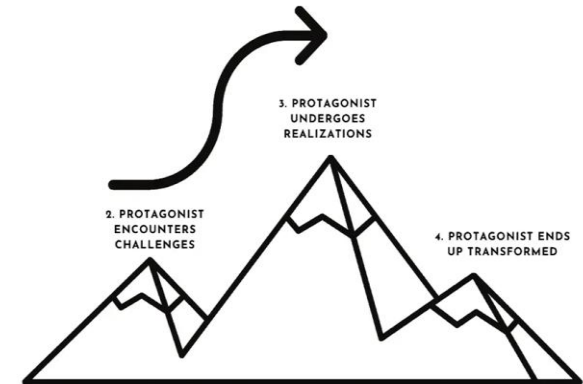
Bildungsroman	a novel that deals with the development of a protagonist, a coming-of-age book
Moral	dealing with right and wrong.
Psychological	dealing with emotions and behaviour.
Pathetic Fallacy	a term used to explain how writers create atmosphere using weather.
Empathy	understanding through experience.
Social Class	A group of people who have a similar socio-economic status e.g wealth, education, occupation.
Honourable	The word honourable has to do with people and actions that are honest, fair, and worthy of respect. An honourable person is someone who believes in truth and doing the right thing.
Reputation	the opinions that are generally held about someone or something.
Integrity	the quality of being honest and having strong moral principles
Supercilious	behaving or looking as though one thinks one is superior to others.
Authorial Intent	The idea that writers have a specific purpose for their text.
Archetype	An archetype is a model, pattern, or universally recognizable idea that can be seen in literature and art.
